# **Project Outline and Aims**

## Outline

The Pinhole Pedallers are an exciting new project who are cycling the west country this summer armed with a giant camera obscura. Beginning in Lands End and ending up in Bristol we will be setting up the camera at local beauty spots, bustling towns, beaches, moors, galleries and festivals along the way.

### What's a Camera Obscura?

In it's most basic form, a camera obscura is a light tight space with a simple lens in one side. Light enters this lens and throws an image on the opposite wall of the space to create an inverted and entrancing live projection of the outside world. The Pinhole Pedallers are scaling-up - our camera obscura is a 3x3 metre collapsible feat of creative genius that can be set up anywhere but leave no trace behind...

### What's the aim?

Members of the public will be invited into the camera to see the landscape in a new light before exploring the image in their own way - by drawing, painting, filming, photographing... The work will be collated on a constantly evolving online exhibition promoted through innovative use of social networking and online blogs. The tour will culminate with an exhibition in Exeter of all the new artwork and in the production of a book. The transportable nature of the obscura means it is at once a valuable educational resource that will engage all ages, a darkroom, a classroom and an magical attraction it its own right.

# Why Bikes?

It makes sense - the bicycle offers the only low-impact, free and fun way to reach landscapes beyond roads and reach the heart of the South-West. It is an efficient way to travel that will keep us in touch with the landscapes we are there to explore with no detrimental effect. The Pinhole Pedallers will be a living breathing demonstration of the green and practical possibilities of the bicycle and communicate a sustainable ethos that might just inspire the people we meet.

#### In a nutshell...

With the camera obscura in tow the Pinhole Pedallers have the potential to connect a broad section of society to the landscapes of Cornwall, Devon and Somerset in a startling new way. Where ever we go we will intrigue, engage and excite and prompt thoughts, questions and ideas.
