

Broken Fingaz

Broken Fingaz began working in 2001 in the Israeli port city of Haifa, as part of the first graffiti wave in Israel. The fact that their home town is located a mere 100km away from the main artistic city - Tel-Aviv, has allowed them to steer clear of popular culture and to develop their unique signature style with a locally inspired approach. What began as a crew of writers quickly developed into an artistic collective that constantly pursues other fields, with the basic belief that art should be free of constants form factors and is much more fun when experienced outside.

In 2004 the crew entered the world of graphic design for the first time, illustrating and designing posters and flyers for parties they have been organizing around their relatively remote city. They quickly became busy designers; illustrating flyers, posters, album covers and logos for Tel Aviv's underground club scene and fashion brands. Enjoying the creative freedom of the underground scenes and with a great hunger to experiment with different materials and styles, they continuously and rapidly developed their skills and began working with other media such as silk screen printing, animation and fine art. Their style that evolved throughout the years stems from a variety of inspirations such as American comic book covers, old school skateboard graphics, tattoos and neo-psychadelia.

In 2007, staying loyal to the town they emerged from, they opened "FingaPrints" - a gallery/graffiti and street culture shop that became a hangout spot as well as a spiritual center for the developing Haifa scene, and a source of inspiration to other artistic pilgrims.

Today, still living, working, and painting in Haifa, the crew's work has spread around.



















